School

Clothing List for Girls

All regulation clothing **must** be obtained from the Sports and Uniform Shop or online at www.schoolblazer.com only, except for items marked with a plus (+). To avoid loss and much inconvenience, each article must be named with the full name and the House marking. New parents are recommended to shop online where a name tagging service is provided free of charge. The aim is that Oundelians should always be tidily and suitably dressed.

Regulation School Dress

- 2 School dark navy jackets with School crest
- *2 pairs School dark navy striped culottes
- 8 School regulation blouses, plain white or blue and white stripe (at least 4 must be white)
- 6 pairs Tights or knee length socks (navy)
- 1 Plain navy woollen or House scarf
- + 1 pair Black leather shoes in a sensible style (not suede, kitten heels or ballet pumps)
(2 pairs for Berrystead pupils)
- + 10 pairs Pants (minimum)
- + 4 Bras (minimum) (should be white or neutral in colour)
- + 3 pairs Pyjamas (or other suitable nightwear)
- + 1 Dressing gown
- + 1 pair Slippers
- + 1 Umbrella

*Culottes must fall to the ankle bone and no longer. Please ensure correct length is ordered as culottes which are worn too long cause a danger of tripping.

Optional

- School navy coat
- School navy blue v-necked jumper
- School light blue v-necked jumper (6th Form Girls only)
- (These items are optional but, if worn, must be the regulation School model – no other type of jumper or coat is permitted.)

Gum Shields

All girls must have a gum shield. Opro offer a full, made to measure service in the first weeks of the Michaelmas Quarter if your daughter does not already have her own. Gum shields are also available in a choice of two sizes on the website and these are useful for the first week or two.

Optional Sports

Oundle School

In addition to the above list, your daughter will require other items of kit for various sports which she will opt for as she moves up the school. These items can all be purchased from the School Sports and Uniform Shop. For a full list of what is required for each sport, please go to the schoolblazer website or the school website. If you are in doubt about whether an item is needed or not, it is better to wait and buy later.

Useful Items (general)

A garment which is useful for winter sports is the School undertop or 'skin' which is worn under the sports shirt for warmth. A garment which is useful for summer sports is the School white hooded sweatshirt. Purchase of both these items is recommended, but not compulsory. A bag for sports kit is essential. An Oundle School Sports Bag is available in three sizes – a small single strap rucksack, a standard games bag and a very large kit bag. The medium size is recommended as a general purpose bag for new pupils.

Team Wear

In addition to the above list, those selected for First Teams may be asked to purchase certain items of team wear. Team shirts, socks etc. are available at the Sports and Uniform Shop. Details of what to buy will be given by the Heads of Girls' Games.

Tour Wear

Those who go on tour with a sports team may be asked to purchase additional items of sportswear for the tour. All items will be available from the Sports and Uniform Shop and details of what to buy will be given by the Heads of Girls' Games.

Additional Items

Brush, comb, nail scissors, 2 face flannels, spongebag, vests, handkerchiefs and gloves – all named. (Berrystead pupils may bring 1 or 2 duvet covers (fireproof and named near opening) to School if they wish.)

Kept at Oundle

- 4 Hangers suitable for blouses and jackets
- 2 Hangers suitable for culottes.
- 4 Large towels (not bath sheets) with securely fastened loops for hanging on middle of one long side. (Towels are available from www.schoolblazer.com if required)
- 1 Plate, mug, knife, fork, spoon, teaspoon (all named) (not needed in Berrystead)

Formal Dress (all items already detailed on Regulation School Dress List)

Formal dress consists of navy jacket, navy striped culottes and white regulation blouse. All girls have two jackets – one of these should be kept for formal occasions and not interchanged with the other, which is for daily wear. Coats and jumpers should not be worn to Chapel on Sundays.

School Uniform

School uniform must be worn at all evening occasions, concerts, debates, lectures, etc., unless otherwise indicated (see "*Smart Change*" below).

Smart Change

Smart change may be worn to performances in the Stahl Theatre, concerts and such like on occasions when announced. Smart change consists of a modest dress, skirt or trousers and a modest top or jacket. Jeans and leather garments are not permitted. Only one set of smart change need be brought to School. All items must be named.

Summer Wear

When the Headmaster announces summer wear, jackets and pullovers need not be worn. Shirts must be of the fitted style and worn outside the culottes. Culottes must be worn properly at all times, with the button fastened and no gap visible between shirt and culottes.

Casual Wear

Casual wear may be worn after lessons, at the Housemaster's/ Housemistress's discretion. Casual wear may be worn on Saturdays after sport and on Sundays after morning Chapel. It may be appropriate on other occasions, with the permission of the Housemaster/ Housemistress. A certain decorum should be observed in the choice of casual wear. It should not be calculated to shock, or be scruffy or dirty. Casual wear that is deemed to be unsuitable will be confiscated. The amount of clothing brought to School should be limited. Three or four sets of casual wear would be plenty.

Dress for Design and Technology

During these lessons, apart from normal School dress, girls should wear sturdy shoes. Aprons or work coats will be provided in the Department. Girls must also bring a means of tying back long hair.

Laundry Temperature

The School Laundry washes by standard mechanical processes. It does not wash pupils' clothing by hand. Pupils' clothing must be capable of being washed at temperatures between 40° and 60° centigrade, with some exceptions that are included below:

Badly-stained white sportswear	80° centigrade
Jerseys, etc. (e.g. wool, acrylic)	30° centigrade

Dry cleaning is available. All woollen garments must be machine washable. No hand washing is undertaken. All clothes are tumble-dried, except jerseys, woollens, etc. The School does not accept responsibility for damage caused to garments by the laundry process.

Naming

All clothes, including casual wear, must be named with the pupil's name and House (see below). Schoolblazer provide a free nametaping application service using specialist permanent printed nametapes. These are sewn on at point of order and any residual nametags are shipped with the order. If you prefer to use woven nametapes these can be obtained online via www.nationalweaving.co.uk.

A charge will be made for marking any clothing brought back to school unnamed. A supply of spare nametapes must be sent with the pupil's clothes for use on new garments bought locally, but please keep some for items bought in the holidays.

Positioning of Nametapes

Pants:	inside back below waistband
Socks:	vertically at the opening
Blouse/knitwear:	inside the collar
Sports shirts/Tracksuit tops:	inside the collar
Towels:	on the end corner
Shoes:	marked inside with indelible ink
Culottes/Tracksuit trousers/skorts:	inside waistband at rear

Parents of girls in the Berrystead are reminded that it is necessary to re-name all items of their daughter's clothing with the appropriate mark of the Senior House to which their daughter has transferred following her two years in the Junior House.

CCF Clothing

CCF Clothing is not needed until the 4th Year. Further details are available from the Armoury.

Additional Information

Every effort has been made to keep the clothing requirements to a minimum. Parents are particularly asked not to pack extra items that are unnecessary and create storage problems. A large soft bag or trunk is required for packing, and an overnight bag for the first night. Both should be clearly marked. A tuckbox may also be brought to School, but is not essential.

Additional Purchases

Items of clothing can be bought during term time from the School Sports and Uniform Shop and are charged on your daughter's bill. Alternatively, items can be bought online from www.schoolblazer.com who can deliver directly to Houses.
