Curriculum

The Oundle curriculum is complex but flexible. We aim to keep parents fully informed and welcome discussion at all stages as choices are made. We encourage parents to discuss academic issues regularly with Housemasters and Housemistresses, and with Tutors, whose brief is to have an overview of an individual pupil's progress and commitment. We provide detailed curriculum leaflets, post information online and arrange receptions at which parents meet their children's subject teachers. Heads of Department and the Deputy Head Academic are always available to give advice.

At all levels every effort is made to ensure that pupils are placed in the teaching groups best suited to their needs and abilities. We set by ability where we feel it is beneficial to do so; at other stages, setting is 'mixed ability'. All pupils from First Form onwards are taught by specialist teachers. The curriculum is under constant review and the subject choices offered will vary from time to time.

In all years, pupils acquire the confidence to learn independently and their natural enthusiasm for their studies is encouraged. We are not bound by the constraints of Common Entrance at 13 for those joining us in First or Second Form, allowing us to be free to be adventurous in our teaching. Even so, we aim to cover the same skills and knowledge so that those trying for a scholarship at 13 are equally as prepared as external candidates.

Our Third Form curriculum is complemented by our unique Trivium course that is studied by all pupils with the intention of placing learning for its own sake at the heart of an Oundle education. We expect pupils to be

academically and intellectually ambitious; our aim is to sow seeds for the future.

The two-year GCSE/IGCSE courses begin formally at the start of the Fourth Form. The core curriculum comprises English Language and Literature, Mathematics and the three Sciences. In addition, each pupil selects five subjects from Arabic (Modern), Art, Chinese, Computing, Design Engineering Technology, Drama, French, Geography, German, Greek (Classical), History, Italian, Latin, Music, Physical Education, Theology Philosophy and Religion, Russian and Spanish. All pupils must choose at least one modern foreign language. Our aim is for all pupils to have a strong basis for study in any of their chosen subjects in the Sixth Form.

We teach traditional academic subjects in the Sixth Form, since we believe these provide the best possible preparation for university and beyond. Within the boundaries of the syllabus the intention is for our pupils to develop enthusiasm for, and genuine interest in, their work. We also offer the Cambridge Pre-U qualification, which is currently offered in eleven academic disciplines; the remaining subjects are examined as A levels.

The Lower Sixth Form can opt to undertake one of several extension courses. The AQA Extended Project Qualification or Oundle's internal Quadrivium course are the most popular: both of these options broaden pupils' education, encourage intellectual curiosity and develop skills of independent research. Pupils wishing to follow particular specialisms at university may, with permission, alternatively choose a one-year ab initio language course leading to an IGCSE in Italian or German, or a music diploma.

Pupils normally join Oundle at 11+, 13+ or 16+. Occasionally entry is possible into other year groups; further details are available from the Registrar.

Prospective families are invited to book an individual visit, or a place at one of the three annual Open Days by contacting the Admissions Office. The next Open Day dates are: 28 September 2019; 8 February 2020; 16 May 2020.

11+ Entry (Boarding and Day)

Each year, over fifty pupils join Oundle at 11+. Boarders enter The Berrystead, the junior boarding House and day pupils enter Scott House, adjacent to The Berrystead. After two years, pupils who wish to board transfer to a senior boarding House and day pupils transfer to Laxton.

Entry is by written examination in the January before entry in September. Applicants take entrance papers in Mathematics, English, Science and a Cognitive Ability Test. Candidates sitting these papers at Oundle have an interview and prospective boarders stay overnight. Boarding and Day places are awarded on the basis of performance in the exams and interview. Academic and Music Scholarships are available at this level of entry.

12+ Entry (Boarders only)

Places permitting, we offer a small number of boarding places at 12+ into The Berrystead. Entrance examinations, similar to those for 11+, are taken in January of the year of entry.

13+ Entry (Boarding and Day)

Most of Oundle's boarders join in the Third Form from a wide range of Prep Schools, either through Common Entrance examinations sat in June each year or the Academic Scholarship examination sat in two stages; the preliminary papers in late January/early February and the main papers in May. Candidates who are not at a Prep School sit Oundle's own entrance tests in the January before entry in September. The examination consists of papers in Mathematics, English, Science and normally a Modern Foreign Language (French/Spanish/German). Candidates performing exceptionally well in these may be invited to sit the main Academic Scholarship examination at Oundle in May.

There are five girls' boarding Houses and eight boys' boarding Houses, each admitting approximately twelve pupils a year. The Registrar can provide help with choosing an appropriate House but it should be noted that houses fill up at least three years ahead of entry.

A number of day places are available each year. Candidates sit Common Entrance, the Academic Scholarship examinations or Oundle's own tests depending on which type of school they are moving on from.

14+ (Boarders only)

A small number of 14+ (Year 10) boarding places are normally available each year through Oundle's own entry tests. These take place either at Oundle or overseas at a British Council Office in January each year.

Sixth Form Entry (Boarding and Day)

Oundle welcomes applications for Sixth Form entry. The minimum entry requirement is three subjects at Grade 6 and three at Grade 7, or equivalent, at GCSE. In practice most successful candidates will have 8 or 9 or equivalent in most subjects. Applicants are asked to provide information in advance and shortlisted candidates are invited to an assessment weekend at Oundle in November. Applicants take papers in three of their chosen subjects for sixth form study or a general paper and two subject papers. They also have an interview. Academic, Art, Music, Sport and Design Engineering Technology scholarships are available at this level of entry.

Overseas Entry

Candidates not taking examinations at Oundle School must sit them at a British Council Office. We expect all applicants from overseas to provide us with a UKiset report at the earliest stage of the application process. UKiset is an adaptive cognitive test measuring underlying ability and language proficiency. For more information, please visit: www.ukiset.com. Bursaries and Scholarships

Bursaries

Financial help towards the payment of fees in cases of proven need is available in some cases. This assistance is available in the form of bursaries which vary in size according to circumstance: some may be as high as 100%. Bursaries are not dependent on scholastic merit but are awarded to pupils who are likely to gain most from an Oundle education and who will contribute fully to the life of the School. Pupils must satisfy the School's academic entry requirements and continue to work to capacity as they progress through the School. Decisions regarding bursary assistance are made approximately two years ahead of entry, therefore parents who feel that they may need the support of a bursary are encouraged to discuss the matter with the School well in advance of the child's due date of entry. Judgements are dependent on a supporting reference from a candidate's previous school, an informal interview and on scrutiny of the family's financial circumstances. Some preliminary assessment may be part of the process.

Scholarships

Scholars are expected to provide the School with intellectual and cultural leadership.

An Oundle Scholarship is highly prized and exist to recognise distinctive academic ability or special talent in Art, Drama, Music, Design Engineering Technology or Sport. General Scholarships are offered to reward all-round talent and leadership. All Scholarships are won in open competition and are awarded solely on merit. Scholarships do not attract fee remission, but may be underpinned by bursary assistance as and when financial circumstances necessitate it.

Fees and Variable Expenses

For Boarders

First Form (Year 7) £28,800 per annum

Second Form (Year 8) £33,420 per annum

Third Form to Sixth Form (Years 9 - 13) £37,890 per annum

For Day Pupils

First Form (Year 7) £18,465 per annum (including lunches and afternoon teas)

Second Form (Year 8) £21,405 per annum (including lunches and afternoon teas)

Third Form to Sixth Form (Years 9 - 13) £24,270 per annum (including lunches and afternoon teas)

Fees include boarding and laundry charges (if applicable), tuition, games, health centre, sports centre, library, lectures and some entertainment (not theatre). Some variable expenses and certain optional extras, including music lessons, are charged on the School Account as necessary.

A term's notice is required when music lessons are to be dropped, other than in exceptional circumstances.

Fees are payable in advance before the beginning of the Michaelmas, Lent and Summer Terms. All fees must be paid by Direct Debit. As any delay in the payment of fees is unfair to the great majority of parents who honour the rule, the School will make a surcharge on outstanding accounts and will add it to the next account. The School will charge 4% above the Barclays Bank base rate, calculated on a daily basis for the period the sum is outstanding. An administration fee of £25 will also be charged in these circumstances.

Fees are reviewed annually by the Governors and are subject to increase by such amount as the Governors consider reasonable. Notice of an increase in the fees will be sent to parents prior to the end of the preceding payment term.

A Level Examination Results 2018/2019

One fifth of the year group secured the equivalent of straight A grades or better, with 19% of all grades at A* level, 46% were graded A* to A, far exceeding the national average of 25.5%. 79% graded A* - B, with five pupils achieving straight A*s.

Oundle prepares pupils for twenty-six different subjects, eleven of which follow the Cambridge Pre-U programme. This year, 27% of Pre-U entries achieved D1 and D2 grades, the equivalent of A* at A level. D1, which identifies the highest-performing pupils, formed 10% of all Pre-U grades awarded.

Half of candidates in thirteen subjects achieved A grade or better. Particular success was seen in Art, Drama and Theatre, German, History, Music and Philosophy and Theology, where 60% or more of all candidates secured A grades or higher.

Pupils are now celebrating securing their university places, including ten pupils who have achieved their offers for Cambridge or Oxford entry, as well as those gaining places to leading international universities in the United States, Hong Kong, Europe and South-East Asia, and at music conservatoire.

GCSE / IGCSE Examination Results 2018/2019

59% of all grades awarded were 9 or 8, against a national average of 10.9%. Across the curriculum, subjects have been graded using the new 9 to 1 system, with 30% of all grades recorded at grade 9 (the equivalent to an A*), a greater number than in any other band. Nearly 40% of the year group recorded grades 9 to 7, the equivalent of A*/A.

English, Classical Greek and Religious Studies provided the headline results with over 70% grades 9 or 8. Over half of the English Language candidates secured grade 9, building upon the department's superb performance in 2018. Oundle offers twenty-five subjects at GCSE / iGCSE

Summary of Results

GCSE

59% of all grades awarded were 9 or 8, against a national average of 10.9%. Across the curriculum, subjects were graded using the new 9 to 1 system, with 30% of all grades recorded at grade 9 (the equivalent to a top A*), a greater number than in any other band. Nearly 40% of the year group recorded grades 9 to 7, the equivalent of A*/A.

A Level

One fifth of the year group secured the equivalent of straight A grades. 19% of all grades were awarded A* and 46% were graded A* to A, far exceeding the national average of 25.5%. 79% were graded A* - B, with five pupils achieving straight A*s.
