General Scholarship Information

Scholarships are numerous, highly prized and awarded in recognition of skills honed, endeavour and potential. All scholarships are won in open competition and are awarded solely on merit. Scholars, who should join Oundle with great pride in their status, are expected to provide the School with intellectual and cultural leadership. Once at Oundle, they can expect to access further opportunity and support in their discipline to help them make the most of their talents. No fee remission is attached to a scholarship as we believe its integrity lies in its honorary capacity. All scholarships can, however, be underpinned by bursary assistance if the financial circumstances of an individual family necessitate it.

Junior Entrance and Junior Academic Scholarship Combined Examinations (Four awards available)

Friday 15 and Saturday 16 January 2021

Candidates to join the Berrystead (boarding) or Scott (day) Houses at age 11 take common papers in Mathematics, English, Science and a Cognitive Ability Test. They may be invited to sit a further paper if their performance in these papers suggests they have scholarship potential. This paper will contain extension questions in Mathematics and English. The assessment takes place in Oundle when candidates for the Berrystead stay in Houses or with members of staff. If necessary, papers for overseas candidates can be sent abroad.

Junior Music Scholarship (Two awards available)

These take place during the week of the Junior Entrance Assessment

Closing date Monday 30 November 2020

Awards are made on the basis of an audition and interview. Candidates usually offer two instruments one of which can be Voice, with at least one at Grade 5 level or higher, although it is not necessary to have taken the examination. Candidates will be asked to perform two pieces on their first instrument and one on their second. Candidates will be asked to sing a verse of an unaccompanied folk song. All candidates will be given a sight-reading test and an aural to test pitch, tonality and rhythm. Please provide a copy of the music to be played at audition as well as the piano accompaniment when returning the entry form. Any music award includes free tuition on specified instruments. Parents and schools of prospective candidates are urged to contact the Director of Music in advance.
