Read Herbert Read's poem 'Night Ride' and then answer the questions that follow.

#### Night Ride

Along the black leather strap of the nightdeserted road 5 swiftly rolls the freighted bus. Huddled together two lovers doze their hands linkt across their laps 10 their bodies loosely interlockt their heads resting two heavy fruits

on the plaited 15 basket of their limbs.

Slowly the bus slides into light. Here are hills detach'd from dark 20

the road uncoils a white ribbon the lovers with the hills unfold

wake cold 25 to face the fate of those who love despite the world.

1. Look again at the first stanza. How effective do you find the description of the road as a 'black / leather strap'?

2. Why do you think the poet spells the words 'linkt' and 'interlockt' (lines 9 and 12) in the old-fashioned way he does?

3. Look again at the fourth stanza. How effective do you consider the description of the heads of the lovers? Explain your answer as fully as possible.

- 4. Look at line 18. Why should the poet say of the bus that it slides 'into light'? (3 marks)
- 5. Describe the situation of the lovers as it is presented in the last stanza. What, for example, is the 'fate' referred to and in what sense do the lovers 'wake cold'?

- 6. Considering the poem as a whole, do you think that the poet is sympathetic or not towards the lovers? You should support your answer with close reference to the text.
